

Sports Premium Grant: Report to Parents 2015/16

Overview of the school

Numbers of pupils and sports premium grant received

Total pupils on roll	585
Amount of sports premium grant	£8000 + £5 per pupil (Y1-Y6)
Total sports premium grant anticipated	£10,400

Nature of support

- £2,700 contribution paid towards the cost of a locality School Sports Coordinator who provides teaching and support from the local secondary academy and attendance at locality sporting events.
- £2000 towards the upkeep of the swimming pool.
- £4,000 cost supports the costs of providing a swimming instructor for pupils from Nursery to Year 6.
- £600 CPD costs to train NQT teachers in delivering high quality PE lessons.
- £400 costs paid towards providing coaching for football, rugby and tennis coaching
- £200 towards the costs of Dance Time
- £250 towards competitive Sports Day expenses.
- £250 towards competitive Swimming Gala expenses.

Curriculum focus of Sports Premium Spending

- The development of swimming as a life skill for all pupils, especially non-swimming pupils.
- The enjoyment of a new sport or sporting activity.
- Participation in locality sport competitions.
- Full participation in a competitive Sports Day
- Full participation in a competitive Swimming Gala.
- Expert teaching knowledge of PE subject specialist.

Measuring the impact of the Sports Premium

The school evaluates the impact of pupils twice a year. Evaluation focuses on measuring the uptake of new sports skills, the numbers of pupils attending after school sports clubs who can be chosen to attend locality sporting events. Through lesson observations, we will evaluate the quality of PE teaching and development of children's skills. In addition, we plan to evaluate the number of pupils who have progressed in their swimming skills and confidence since September 2015, e.g. the conversion on non-swimmers to swimmers.
